Institute has a well equipped library. This helps students from various colleges the carryout their research. Faculty members of the institute are also encouraged to continuously carryout research projects.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

Library is yearly updated with textbooks, e-journals, reference books and the likes. Student and Staff make use of the available literary resources for their references.
