Distinctiveness:

The institution is committed to address its thrust areas like accessibility, accountability, and affordability. In the view of its vision and mission, the institute thrives upon creating accountable citizen for today and tomorrow which in return shapes the collective common tendency and ensures peaceful co-habitation and aims at establishing beauty and peace in the society at large. The institute's department of Political Science, organizes a study tour every winter assembly session. This year (2023-24), the department sent two students for the CPA (Commonwealth Parliamentary Training Course). This course is useful for political science students to understand the democratic process.

The Commonwealth Parliamentary Training Course and Observation of Legislative AssemblyWork Study Tour aims to provide parliamentarians and legislative practical insights into parliamentary procedures, legislative processes, and governance practices. This program fosters the professional development of political science students, focusing on strengthening democratic practices within the Commonwealth by sharing knowledge and observing legislative best practices. The course not only encourages capacity building among students but also nurtures the ideals of transparency, accountability, and effective governance.

The training course is designed to be immersive, practical, and interactive. The format typicallyincludes lectures, case study analyses, practical workshops, and question-and-answer sessions lead to cover specific aspects of parliamentary work, and policy advisors. Each session is tailored to cover specific aspects of parliamentary work, such as drafting legislation, interpreting parliamentary rules, and understanding budget approvals. Participants are encouraged toactively engage in discussions and apply the concepts learned to hypothetical and real-world scenarios. Additionally, the study tour includes a practical observation component, wherein participants attend live sessions of legislative assemblies to witness parliamentary operations first-hand. They observe debates, committee discussions, and legislative decision-making processes, gaining valuable insights into how legislative practices function on the ground. This pain of the program enables participants to compare different parliamentary models, both bicameral and unicameral while observing diverse approaches to governance across Commonwealth countries.

Objectives
